Meet Kristine

Kristine and her colleagues in the Moline Sr. High School Foreign Language Department use eBeam Projection and Scrapbook interactively to annotate items within various applications including web browsers and PowerPoint slides. During class images and video are displayed through the projector to illustrate the past and present cultures and societies who speak the languages being studied. Using the displayed images, students have the opportunity to utilize visual cues to build skill development in vocabulary acquisition and grammar. Students also work on the board to caption their own collected images in Spanish and French and/or bring in additional media to illustrate a passage written in Spanish or French which demonstrates their comprehension of the passage.
